The Gospel of Luke

Principles for Prayer

Luke 11:5-13

- 1. Pray with Boldness: The Midnight Visitor (vs.5-8)
 - God is not a sleeping neighbor who is bothered by our requests and He does not need to be badgered into acting upon the good requests of His people.
 - A. **Be Merciful to the Wicked on Account of the Righteous** (Gen 18:22-33) Abraham requested for God to spare the wicked cities if only a small number of righteous people lived there (vs.23-26). After God granted this request, Abraham boldly requested increasing leniency five additional times (vs.27-33).
 - B. **Show Me Your Glory** (Ex 33:18-23; cf. Num 12:8) God had visited Moses in a burning bush (Ex 3:2) and spoke with him as men talk to one another (Ex 33:11), but Moses asks to see the face of God (v.20).
- 2. Pray with Confidence: Asking, Seeking, and Knocking (vs.9-10)
 - A. Prayer Without Confidence? An Example (Acts 12:1-19)
 Fervent prayer can be done without believing that God will do what we ask (Acts 12:2ff); He is able to give what we ask and more (Eph 3:20).
 - B. **Ask God for What You Need and Want** (James 4:2-3; Ps 37:4-5)

 The reason why we do not have what we need is because we do not ask for it or because we ask for good things with wrong motives.
 - C. Receive Anything Asked According to God's Will (1 John 5:14) Christians have absolute confidence that if we ask anything that is in accordance with God's will (cf. Rom 8:29) that it will be given to us.
- 3. Pray With Assurance: A Father Gives Good Gifts (vs.11-13)
 - A. **God Gives Good Gifts** (2 Kings 20:1-3, 6; 2 Chron 1:7-12)
 God's answer to the requests of kings Solomon and Hezekiah help us to see
 God's desire to give good things to His children.
 - B. God Gives the Best Gift (Luke 4:13; cf. 1 Cor 12;4-11; James 1:17))
 Jesus promises that we will not only receive what we ask for, but that we will receive God Himself who is the giver of all good gifts.
- 4. How to Deal with Prayers Not Answered as We Desire (2 Cor 12:7-10)
 We may not always understand why good things that we ask for are withheld from us, but we can rest upon the goodness of God (Ps 119:68) in His bringing about what is best for us (cf. Rom 8:29).
